VISITOR AND TRANSPORTATION GUIDE TO THE PANUM BUILDING, UNIVERSITY OF COPENHAGEN

Getting There:

By Foot: If you're in central Copenhagen, you can easily walk to the Panum Building. From Nørreport Station, it's about a 15-minute walk. Head north along Nørre Allé, then turn right onto Blegdamsvej.

By Bicycle: Copenhagen is bike-friendly, and the Panum Building is equipped with bike racks. From Nørreport Station, it's a 5-minute bike ride. You can also rent a bike from numerous rental stations across the city.

By Bus: Several bus routes serve the Panum Building:

- Bus 6A: Stops directly outside the Panum Building on Blegdamsvej.
- **Bus 42, 184, and 185**: Stops on Tagensvej, a short walk from the building. Buses run frequently, and you can purchase tickets via the DOT Mobilbilletter app or at ticket machines at major stations.

By Metro:

- **M3 (City Circle Line)**: Get off at **Trianglen Station**; it's about a 7-minute walk to the Panum Building.
- **M1 or M2**: Get off at **Nørreport Station**, then either walk or take a bus. Tickets can be purchased at metro stations via ticket machines or through the DOT Mobilbilletter app.

By Car: If you're driving, there are limited parking spaces available around the Panum Building. You can park in nearby public parking facilities or use street parking, which may require a parking fee. Make sure to check local parking rules.

By Taxi: Taxis are readily available in Copenhagen, and you can book one through various apps like TAXA 4x35 or hail one from the street. The ride from central Copenhagen to the Panum Building typically takes around 10-15 minutes, depending on traffic.

Ticket Purchasing:

Public Transportation Tickets:

- **DOT Mobilbilletter App**: Download the app to purchase tickets for buses, metro, and trains. It's easy to use and offers tickets for different zones.
- **Ticket Machines**: Available at metro and train stations. You can buy single tickets, city passes, or multi-ride tickets.
- **Rejsekort**: A prepaid travel card that you can top up and use across all public transport. It's convenient if you plan to travel around Copenhagen frequently.

Accessibility:

The Panum Building is fully accessible, with ramps, elevators, and designated parking spaces for visitors with disabilities. Public transport options are also equipped with facilities for those with mobility challenges.
